Attendance

Regular attendance is essential to ensure uninterrupted progress and to enable children to exceed their potential. We actively involve the children in achieving this by holding weekly assemblies with a reward for each class who has 100% attendance. Certificates are awarded termly and yearly for all children who achieve 100%. With these rewards in place, the children wholeheartedly strive to be part of the winning class and the support of each other is a pleasure to see; please support your child and ensure they are regular attenders.

Good attendance is important because: your child needs to be in the academy to be able to learn and achieve; lessons are taught in a sequence and it can be difficult to catch up if a lesson is missed; children need to have relationships with others and to form lasting friendships; it develops a child's

Pupil Reward Points

Being in the right place, at the right time, doing the right thing!

The reward scheme allows children to earn points for showing 'Green Behaviour' which may consist of trying hard in their work, being courteous and polite (possibly holding a door open), showing respect to others, arriving at school in time for registration and having the correct uniform. Children also earn 5 points if they are picked to celebrate their work in the Thursday 'Star of the Week' assembly. Children additionally earn points through job roles - the wage of points is preparing children for their later life. Children save points and spend them at the academy swap shop. Please see the trophy as to who the current leaders are.



Writing

Every two weeks, the Butterflies and the Ladybirds will be studying a specific text linked to their Topic which will serve as a stimulus to their writing. This term we will be looking at books to do with 'We are Hull'. We will be looking at a range of text types; including letters, reports and poems.

There is an additional 30 minute **phonics and handwriting** session four times a week.

We also have a daily **guided reading** session in which children do a range of activities such as focused work with the teacher, comprehension, phonics tasks and the use of ICT.

Big Writing is part of this pattern and allows the children to produce an independent piece of extended writing, to 'show off' what they know and have learnt.

Your child has a **home reading book**. This book is appropriate for the level your child is secure at and is classed as an 'easy read' to give them confidence and help with their comprehension. We ask for you to write a comment in your child's reading journal based on how they read and find the text.

Reading books are changed once a week.

Blogging forms an important part of our learning and we are keen for all children to share their ideas via the blog both at home and in school on a regular basis.



Maths

The Butterflies and Ladybirds are learning to get better at **reasoning** within the Maths. This enables the children to explain how they get their answers and explores their investigative skills. It is an essential skill to have! One way to help children use their reasoning skills is within questioning, such as:

- How do you know...?
- How did you solve the problem...?
- Justify your reasoning...
- Do you agree that...?
- Prove how you know...?

We also have **weekly arithmetic papers** on a Friday to test our mental maths knowledge so we recommend plenty of addition, subtraction and times table practise.



Reading

To promote *reading for pleasure*, we have Bug Club.

Bug Club is a fantastic online resource that allows reading to be interactive and exciting. It takes children on a personalised reading journey where the only limits are their imaginations. Not only does it allow children to read a range of books online, but it also delivers comprehension style questioning to promote children's understanding of the books that they have read.

All children should have been provided with usernames and passwords for the website. Please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher if you require another copy.



P.E.

Ladybirds lessons are on **Thursday (outdoor)** and **Friday (indoor)**

Butterflies lessons are on **Tuesday (indoor)** and **Friday (outdoor)**

The academy has supplied each child with an indoor P.E. kit.

Homework

Homework will be set each week.

It will consist of:

- **Maths** - This goes out on a Friday and is to be completed by the following Friday.
- **Spellings**—These are to be practised in preparation for a weekly spelling test every Friday.
- **Talk Homework** - This will be sent out on a Wednesday in preparation for Friday's Big Write. This encourages children to talk about their writing ideas at home with an adult.
- **Reading**—Each child will have their own reading book, which they will need to practise at home. Children are required to read 4 x a week at home.

Ensuring this is completed every week, children will be rewarded with a reward trip at the end of the term!

Topic

This term our topic will link to the city of culture called 'We are Hull' .

As Geographers we will be using an atlas to identify and name the continents and oceans of the world. We will create a weather chart and predict what the weather will be like in Antarctica.

As Writers we will be looking at Non- Chronological Reports. We will explore the features of non- chronological reports and then we will use these to write a report about Antarctica. We will also write a letter from Amy Johnson, describing her journey from London to Australia.

As Historians we will be learning about historical events such as, how people from Hull played a key role in explorations to Antarctica. We will research the life of Amy Johnson using different sources such as objects, books and the internet. Through our learning we will begin to use words and phrases such as 'before' 'after' 'past' and 'present'.

As Artists we will create a colour wheel. We will be experimenting with hot and cold colours and we will learn how to mix colours together to form a cold picture.

As Scientists we will be learning all about ourselves. We will be investigating what humans need to survive.
